UN3373/Exempt Specimens/Dry Ice as SPD

ExpressJet Airlines (XE) will be operating United Express (UAX) flights numbered 5650-5724 from June 3 through August 31, 2009. The chart below listing UAX carrier regulations governing the acceptance of UN 3373: Biological Substance – Category B, exempt human and animal patient specimens and dry ice as SPD small package shipments has been modified to include XE.

Please note: except for the addition of XE information, all other policies contained in the chart below are unchanged from the chart issued in April 2009.

¹ Flight ranges are subject to change.

² This category includes blood and organs intended for human or animal transfusion or transplant; and human or animal samples transported for routine testing not related to the diagnosis of an infectious disease.

³ Package must be packed, labeled and the air waybill marked according to IATA regulations for UN3373.

⁴ - Up to 5.5 pounds of dry ice is accepted in SPDs at a UA passenger terminal.

- Up to 50 pounds of dry ice is accepted in SPDs at UA SPD Centers in LAX, ORD and SFO, if the commodity being cooled is a “medical shipment” and is not dangerous goods.

- Up to 99 pounds of dry ice is accepted in SPDs tendered at a UA freight facility. If the commodity being cooled is dangerous goods, DG marking and paperwork requirements apply.

⁵ - Quantity of dry ice accepted per package is subject to the rule that the combined weight of dry ice in all cargo bins on XE, S5 and RP flights may not exceed 77 pounds per aircraft.
